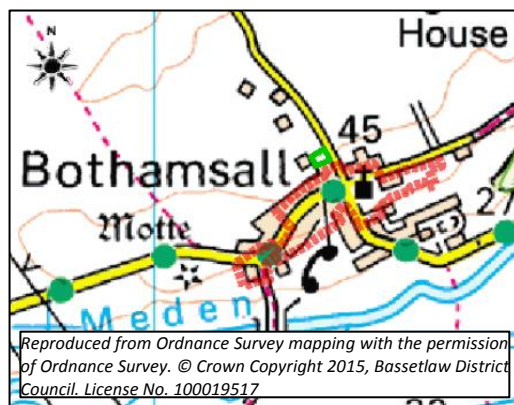


**Unregistered Park & Garden:
Bothamsall Cemetery**

Description & historic information:

Bothamsall Cemetery, opened c1912, with feature brick boundary wall and iron entrance gates (a consecrated war memorial) on east side. Earliest burial dates to July 1912. Red brick wall with blue brick plinth band and blue brick triangular coping, with brick piers at approximately 2.5m intervals with pyramidal stone copings.

Entrance contains iron entrance gates with inscription "GGM 1953" across top. These are a consecrated war memorial, installed to commemorate local resident Corporal Gordon Geoffrey Moody, who died in the Korean War on the 27th May 1953. The gates were made by Reginald Hardwick of Cauntton (near Newark) and paid for by Corporal Moody's father.

Cemetery has hedge boundary to west, with concrete post and wire mesh fencing on north and south sides. Cemetery contains a range of significant monuments including the grave of Lance Corporal W Pashley. Semi-mature trees across centre of site.

Features of significance:

Ornate brick wall with iron entrance gates (a consecrated war memorial to Corporal Gordon Geoffrey Moody), a range of significant monuments including the grave of Lance Corporal W Pashley, hedge boundary, semi-mature trees.
