
Unregistered Park & Garden: Hill Top Remise, Holbeck






Description & historic information:

Rectangular remise comprising area of open grassland with tree/hedge belt around the entire boundary, alongside Elma Lane. Early-20th century in date, created to aid hunting. Aldo Leopoldⁱ defines a remise as *"a small covert, an acre or two in size, of mixed trees planted just for game"*. Has distinctive entrances at both ends. Probably planted for the 6th Duke of Portland. Site is adjacent to Hill Top Farm, an early-19th century stone-built farm comprising farmhouse and range of outbuildings.

Features of significance:

Tree-lined rectangular enclosure of open space, currently arable, originally laid out for hunting. Adjacent farmhouse and range of outbuildings, early-19th century.
