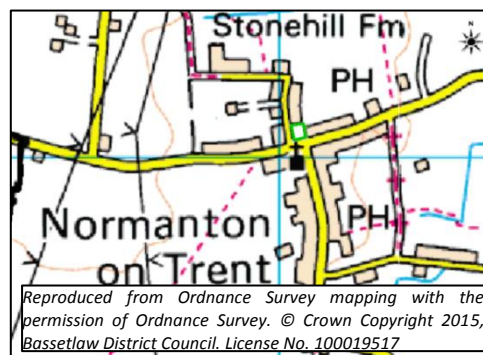


Unregistered Park & Garden:
Normanton on Trent Cemetery

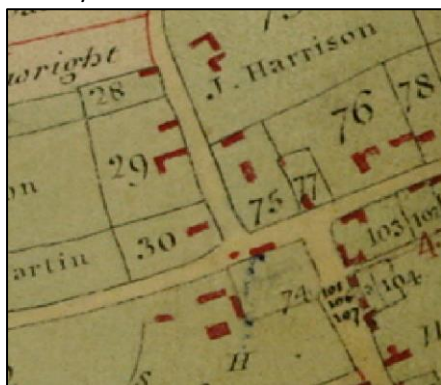

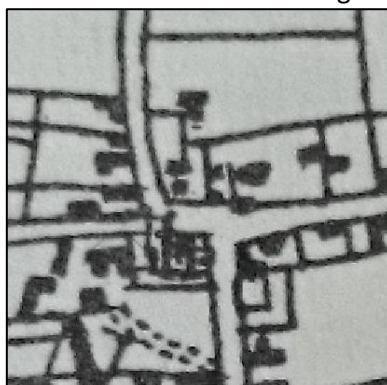


Description & historic information:

Small municipal cemetery, rectangular shape, located opposite to St Matthew's Church, earliest burial appears to be February 1867. Located on the site of an earlier farm, demolished to make way for the cemetery. Main entrance on south side, with Skerry Sandstone gate piers and iron gates (which match those at the church on the opposite side of the road). Boundary is marked by holly hedges to south (front) and west (side), with 19th century brick wall to north and various fences/walls to east. Several mature and semi-mature trees throughout the cemetery.

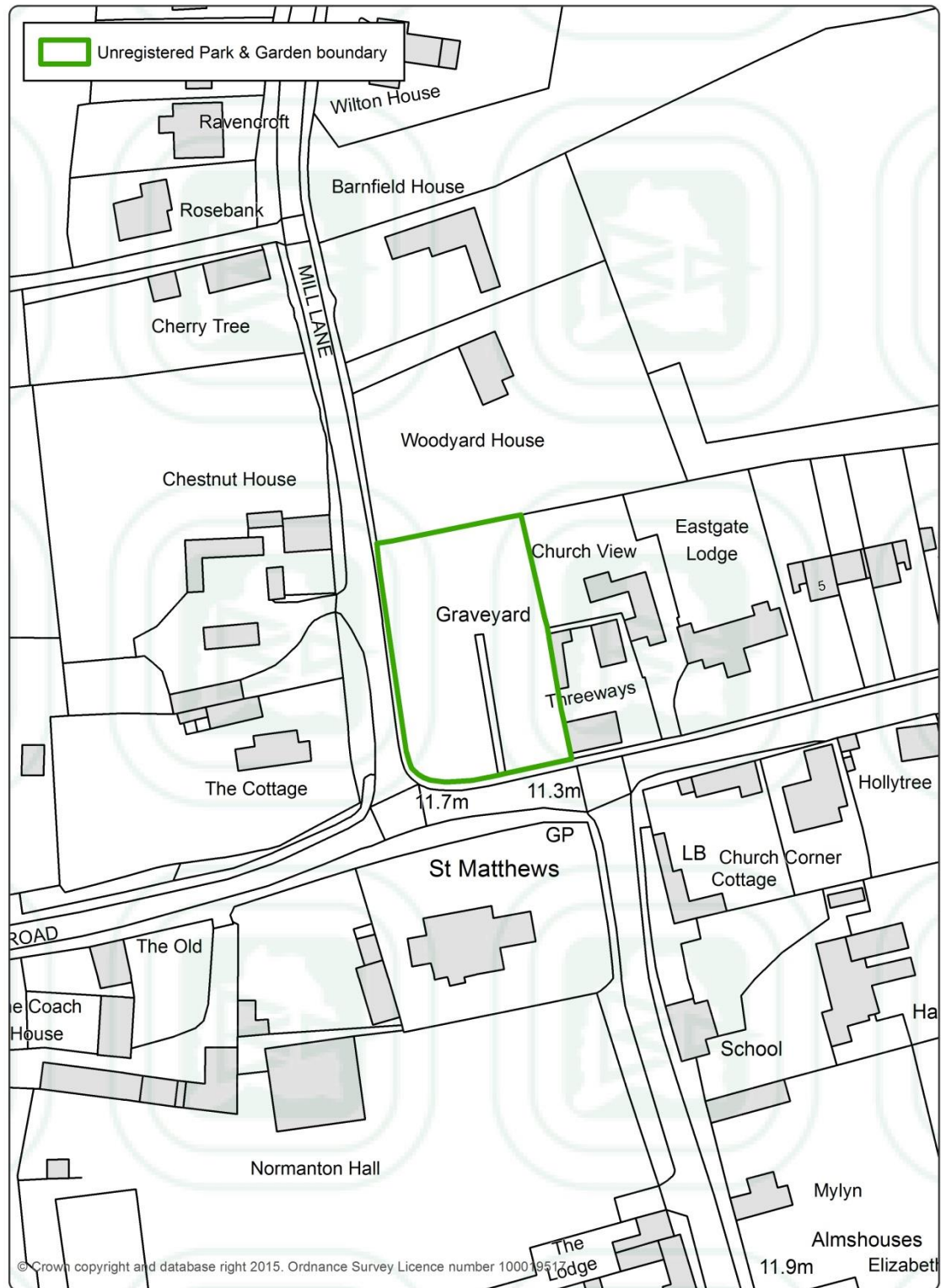
Gate piers and gates at main entrance
