



## Summary Document

Bassetlaw, Newark and Sherwood Community Safety Partnership has produced a new Community Safety Plan that sets out how the members of the Partnership intend to work together to reduce crime, disorder, substance misuse and fear of crime in our area for a three-year rolling period.

To decide on priorities or themes for our 2008 - 2011 plan analysis of the level and patterns of crime and disorder, analysis of changes that have taken place over the past three years and views expressed by our communities on what should be prioritised have all been considered. 
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# Bassetlaw, Newark and Sherwood Community Safety Partnership

## Our Objectives

- To reduce household burglary and vehicle crime in hotspot locations
- To use environmental schemes to reduce the opportunities for domestic burglary and vehicle crime
- To reduce the rewards of committing offences by introducing property marking and identifying and minimising outlet opportunities

- To improve satisfaction levels in the most vulnerable groups
- To reduce non-crime incidents of vehicle nuisance in target locations
- To cut the number of criminal damage offences in target locations by introducing diversion activity
- To improve the behaviour of target groups in hotspot locations

- To reduce the impact of alcohol and drug-related night time economy incidents
- To reduce the number of repeat victims of Domestic Abuse by setting up a Sanctuary scheme and introducing awareness raising among the staff of Partner agencies
- To reduce the number of repeat Domestic Abuse perpetrators

- To reduce the number of repeat victims of household burglary
- To reduce the number of crimes committed by prolific offenders
- To reduce the number of victims of distraction burglary by introducing no cold calling zones
- To reduce the re-offending rates of those supervised by Probation

- To reduce the number of first time entrants to the Youth Justice System by, among other actions, implementing a local youth crime reduction strategy
- To cut the rate of re-offending among young people
- To increase the school attendance rate by introducing "Truancy Watch" in target locations and implementing a Safer Schools programme

- To reduce the percentage of people who perceive ASB in their area is linked to alcohol or drugs, through initiatives including training for safer neighbourhood teams on the issues.
- To increase the number of drug users in effective treatment
- To reduce the number of alcohol-related hospital admissions
