The Consultation Proposals Map Update 2014

What is the Proposals Map?

This consultation Proposals Map updates the adopted Proposals Map from December 2011 (linked to the production of the Core Strategy and Development Management DPD) with the addition or the Preferred Options Site Allocations and is available as part of the Preferred Options Site Allocations consultation. Once adopted, it will replace the existing Proposals Map and contribute to the portfolio of documents forming the Bassetlaw Local Development Framework. It sets out geographical information relating to:

- The Preferred Options housing and employment site allocations;
- Areas of protection for nationally and locally designated biodiversity areas and sites;
- Areas at risk from flooding; and
- Specific areas and land uses to which policies apply as set out in the Core Strategy and Development Management Policies Development Plan Document.

How do I use the Proposals Map?

The Proposals Map can be used to identify the specific areas covered by different policies as they apply across the District. It should be read in conjunction with the Core Strategy and Development Management Policies DPD, and the Preferred Options Site Allocations DPD.

The accompanying Inset Maps provide more detailed information relating to specific settlements within Bassetlaw. The areas to which the Inset Maps relate are shown on the main Proposals Map and a list of all inset maps is set out below.

An electronic version of this consultation Proposals Map is also available via the Council's website.

Will the Proposals Map be updated to reflect changes in local circumstance?

Site designations do change over time, however, and boundaries (e.g. to Conservation Areas) may also be revised. It will, therefore, always be worth checking with the Council before submitting a planning application if you think that there may have been changes to designations or to policy area boundaries that would affect the site of the proposed development.

Following advice from Nottinghamshire County Council (as the minerals authority for the area), the Proposals Map does not identify any protected minerals sites. Once the Nottinghamshire County Council Minerals and Waste Development Framework is adopted, the Proposals Map will be amended to show all relevant sites. In the meantime, the proposed sites can be found on the County Council's website.

How do I respond to the Site Allocations consultation document?

This Consultation Draft Proposals Map has been produced to accompany the Preferred Options Site Allocations Consultation Paper. If you would like to comment on the proposed housing and employment sites, proposed protected open spaces and the development

boundary changes that will incorporate these sites, please send your comments in as part of the Preferred Options Site Allocations consultation.

In particular, we need to know whether you agree with our proposals and whether you think we have identified the issues that will need to be addressed (e.g. highways improvements or new school provision) if these sites are to be allocated. If you disagree with the Council's proposals, you will need to state why and to provide realistic alternative proposals.

The formal consultation will run for an eight-week period starting on Monday 3rd February 2014 and the deadline for responses is **5pm on Monday 31st March 2014**. Please be aware that representations made about this document (including your name and address) cannot be treated as confidential and may be made publically available. Any comments made before this formal consultation period will only be recorded as an objection or support to the principle of the site(s) allocation, as all the details underpinning the preferred allocations will not yet be available.
