# The Bassetlaw Plan The Next Stage...

Bassetlaw District Council has launched the next stage of consultation on its Draft Bassetlaw Local Plan, which sets out the Council's priorities for housing, regeneration and other development in the district up to 2037.

Local residents and businesses are just some of the people who are being encouraged to be part of this latest stage of engagement, which was launched on 25th November and will last for eight weeks.

Due to the current restrictions in place to prevent the transmission of Coronavirus, this consultation will take place digitally with the Draft Local Plan, supporting information and a questionnaire all available on the Council's websits; in addition to 25 virtual meetings that will take place for residents to discuss the plans for their local areas.

This latest stage takes account of the responses that were received as part of the Council's consultation in January 2020 and were used to update the latest Bassetlaw Plan.

"The Bassetlaw Plan is fundamental to the growth and success of our District over the next 17 years. As well as dealing with the amount of housing that is required in the district, the Bassetlaw Plan sets out the Council's aspirations for how land is allocated for jobs, investment and increased opportunities for local people
